Short introduction to the CLS study

CLS is the first long-term study in Germany on 'leaving care' of young adults leaving residential child and foster care. Over a period of several years, the long-term study examines the transition of young people between life in a foster family or a residential group or other forms of assisted living and adult life.

The study covers topics such as, organization of everyday life, goals and dreams of young people, living and learning during the transition phase. Currently, we know too little about the life situations and life paths of young people who grow up in residential groups or foster families for a while or even for a longer period of time. The CLS study is funded by the Federal Republic of Germany – by the Federal Ministry for Family Affairs, Senior Citizens, Women and Youth (BMFSFJ). Completion of the study is planned for 2030.

Take the Local railway (S-Bahn) line S8 or line S9 to Station "Stadion" From there it is about a ten-minute walk to the sports school (Landessportbund Hessen)

From Hauptbahnhof/central station: Take the S-Bahn line S8 or line S9 (Direction Frankfurt Airport/Flughafen) to the S-Bahn Station "Stadion".

From the airport: Take the S-Bahn line S8 or line S9 (direction Frankfurt Hauptbahnhof/central station) to S-Bahn Station "Stadion".



Directions to the city centre: Walk to the S-Bahn station "Stadion" and take the S-Bahn line S8 or S9 (direction Frankfurt Hauptbahnhof). To get to the city center, get off at Frankfurt "Hauptwache".
